

Some of us are pursuing advanced practice and specialisation but we can all do much more to contribute to better health outcomes.


We must find the courage and ability to overcome the obstacles and transform our practices.

Moving towards Universal Healthcare Coverage

ALBERT FRANCIS DOMINGO, MD, MPH

Consultant, World Health Organization

Dr. Albert Domingo finished his undergraduate degree in Molecular Biology and Biotechnology and his Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of the Philippines. He was awarded a Chevening Scholarship by the United Kingdom, where he earned a Master of Science degree in Health Systems and Public Policy from the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. He has a decade of experience in global public health at country and international levels.

He started his career as a Health Policy Fellow of the Health Policy Development Program, deployed to the DOH Bureau of Local Health Development where he assisted with the policy framework for province-wide investment plans for health. While working at the DOH, Dr Domingo also entered law school at the UP College of Law, up to the third year. He moved on to supervising a team that supported the preparation of Philippine policy issuances on universal health care (UHC), regularly reporting to the Secretary of Health to provide accurate and coherent data, figures and statistics for strategic communication.

Dr. Domingo joined the World Health Organization as a consultant at the Regional Office for the Western Pacific, working on health systems strengthening through NCD interventions. WHO has deployed him to Solomon Islands in the South Pacific, where he was in charge of programmes related to NCD and Health through the Life-Course. Dr Domingo returned to a Manila-based post just last year, so that he could resume providing technical support and advice on health systems to the Department of Health and PhilHealth, especially now that the landmark universal health care bill is about to become law.

When he is not working on health sector policy and reform, you might find him doing other things such as keeping different species of tropical fish, or teaching an indoor cycling class at a local fitness gym.

National E-Health Framework **ENRIQUE A. TAYAG, MD, PHSAE, FPSMD, CESO III** Director, Knowledge Management and Information Technology Service (KMITS)

For more than 25 years, since graduating from the University of the East Ramon Magsaysay Medical Center (UERMMCI). Dr. Tayag has focused his career path in public health, particularly Epidemiology and Universal Health Care.

Having earned his medical degree in UERMMCI, the Manila-born physician went to San Lazaro Hospital in Manila in 1988-1990 for Residency Training in Infectious Diseases. He completed his training in Epidemiology in 1990-1992 through the Field Epidemiology Training Program (FETP) of the Department of Health. He moved to the DOH in 1998 and quickly earned laurels as he occupied various leadership positions in the bureaucracy. He became the first Director of the National Center for Infectious and Degenarative Diseases in 2000.

His interviews in all media on public health issues have prepared him well in becoming the Official Spokesperson of the DOH since 2005. Just 14 years after graduating from ERM, he also earned a national honor: the Secretary of Health Award for outstanding Epidemiologist given to him in 1998. He also earned a national honor: Most Outstanding Alumni (PUBLIC SERVICE) 50th Year Anniversary UERMMC, 2007 and Most Outsatnding Alumnus (COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP), UERMMC Alumni Homecoming.

Strengthening Responsible use of Medicines thru Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee

DR. IRENE FARINAS, MD, RPH Medical Officer IV, Pharmaceutical Division Department of Health

Essential medicines are an integral and crucial part of Universal Health Care (UHC) because they are an indispensable element for delivery of services and are also a requirement for high-quality care. Aside from being a commodity required for service delivery, medicines also contribute significantly to government and household spending on health.



This country has a complex medicines supply chain structure due to its devolved health system. The DOH has the primary responsibility of managing all medicines intended for use in the national health programs (e.g., TB, malaria), medicines access programs (e.g., breast cancer, insulin) as well as for emergencies and disasters. These are delivered to the regional health offices and distributed to health facilities managed by LGUs including hospitals (provincial, city and municipality), rural health units and barangay health stations. Given the devolved set-up of health system paired with limited resources and capacity of Local Government Units (LGUs), medicines supply management remains a challenge and has led to either overstock or undersupply of essential medicines. The availability of medicines in the facility however, depends not only on good supplies but also on effective management and good governance on pharmaceutical supply chain. There have been several approaches developed to improve the management and use of medicines in various health settings. Some inefficiencies on medicines management result from lack of an effective forum that brings together pharmacists, clinicians, administrators and other stakeholders to balance the demand for quality care with limited resources. There may be gaps among stakeholders about the availability, safety and accessibility of essential medicines. The Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committees (PTCs) are a forum that may exist at any level within the healthcare system and can address these gaps.

PTCs play a vital role in rational medicines use, an important pillar of the Philippine Medicines Policy (PMP). Its main responsibility is to develop and maintain in their respective organizational set-up an essential drugs list, which serves as the basis for the procurement program. Furthermore, the PMP 2017-2022 emphasizes to establish and capacitate PTCs in the LGU level that would serve as guide for the LGU officials in all matters concerning management of medicines.

CPD Area: Environmental Factors and Global Trends

Right after passing the Physician Licensure Board Exam in 1998, Dr. Irene V. Florentino-Fariñas immediately got hired by the Department of Health where she was deployed as a Rural Health Physician under the Doctors-to-the-Barrios Program. Her stint as a Rural Doctor opened her eyes to the reality that more things are needed to be done to empower common folks when it comes to exercising their right to health, especially in the access, availability and affordability of medicines. As a Public Health enthusiast, Dr. Florentino-Fariñas is keen on crafting evidence-based policies aimed at providing equitable, quality and cost-effective health goods and services to the people.

In 2014, she emerged as the sole Asia-Pacific Quality Use of Medicines Scholarship Winner and was given the honor to speak in the National Prescribing System (NPS) Medicinewise 4th Biennial Symposium, Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Center in Queensland, Australia. She has been conferred a degree of Master in National Security Administration at the National Defense College of the Philippines where she received academic honors during her one-year full scholarship in 2016. This automatically

earned her a rank of Lieutenant Colonel had she chosen to be commissioned in the military force. As a national security administrator, she has been equipped with broad skills and the proper attitude necessary to perform multifarious responsibilities and meet the broad challenges emanating from the internal and external environment. Her thesis on Pharmaceutical Security, a least known endeavor in the country, has been institutionalized in the soon-to-belaunched Philippine Medicines Policy of the Duterte administration. She is very much involved in the drafting of national strategies to prevent and manage pharmaceutical shortage that can trigger a national health crisis.

Dr. Florentino-Fariñas also worked as an Emergency Physician in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in 2004 and is also a licensed Pharmacist from the University of the Philippines Manila where she has also been awarded the outstanding alumni award in government service in June, 2018. She was a silver medalist from Manila Science High School, has one kid, happily married and proudly keeps a wide collection of souvenir items from all the places she had been locally and internationally. •

Pharmacists in Mental Health ANGELICA MARIE BOLOS, RPH

National Drug Policy Compliance Officer Department of Health

Abstract:

The state affirms the basic right of all Filipinos to mental health as well as the fundamental rights of people who require mental health services. The government through the Mental Health Act (RA 11036) shall ensure that there are policies, strategies, and services that are emplaced. Moreover, Republic Act 9502 or the Cheaper Medicines Act, aims to ensure availability and accessibility of affordable quality essential medicines such as those prescribed in mental health. With this, pharmacists play a vital role both in public health and the private sector.



Post-typhoon Haiyan paved the way to the institutionalization of Medicines Access Program for Mental Health (MAP-MH) in the primary health care facilities such as the Rural Health Units (RHUs), some infirmaries, district hospitals up to the provincial and regional hospital in Region VIII. The region was the very first to implement the mental health program including its access to medicines in 90% of primary care facilities whose Municipal Health Officers (MHOs) were trained in WHO's Mental Health Gap Action Plan (mhGAp) or any other modules on mental health management by their international partners such as IMC or USAID. The increased number of health workers trained on the management of mentally challenged individuals posed to an increased number of diagnosed patients and likewise skyrocketing demand for psychotropic medications.

The pharmacists hired by the Department of Health played a vital role in the establishment of a system wherein it aimed to provide easy access to mental health medications by the healthcare providers for their identified patients. The presence of the pharmacists in the public health sector ensures quality medications are provided to clients and generally strengthens the health care system. The system and protocols being implemented with MAP-MH in Region 8 were not only beneficial to the mental health program and to its patients, but it also applies with the other public health program jointly implemented by the local government units and DOH as well.

Professional Development and Creating Impact on Pharmacy Practice

The macro environment within which pharmacists practice is evolving rapidly. Changes in medicines, the health status of patients, funding for services, access to information and developments in health systems will all have an impact on how we practice. Some will create challenges while others such as digital healthcare, automation, precision medicines, collaborative care and new services will create opportunities for enhanced value in pharmacy practice.

To take these opportunities we will need to be empowered, equipped, enabled and appropriately located as pharmacists. When we leave pharmacy school and pass registration exams, we are deemed competent pharmacists. However, the body of knowledge about medicines, the skills we need, the regulations governing us, models of practice and societal expectations all change. Professional development is a life-long obligation we must pursue to ensure we are not only capable of serving our patients but that we are relevant, employable and have meaningful, rewarding careers.

Pharmacists in an Evolving Regulatory Environment PAUL MARVIN QUIZON, RPH, MS

Head of Regulatory Affairs, Philippines Global Regulatory Affairs International - Asia Pfizer, Inc.

Abstract:

Pharmacists in the industry, particularly those in regulatory affairs, quality and supply chain, are perceived to be less patient-centered as compared to those in the clinical or patient-care settings. However, the current local regulatory environment that hugely affects the supply of life-saving and essential medicines to our patients clearly show how pharmacists in regulatory affairs, quality and supply chain had evolved to rise above the challenges. This presentation will discuss the present regulatory issues faced by pharmacists in various fields of practice and how these impact patients' lives. Case examples will be presented to illustrate how pharmacists can be heroes for the patients they serve.



Paul is a Registered Pharmacist who obtained his Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy in 2005 and Master of Science in Pharmacy (Industrial Pharmacy) in 2011 from the University of the Philippines Manila. He is currently taking-up his PhD in Health Sciences by Research from the same university. He was the 5th Placer in the January 2006 Philippine Pharmacists Licensure Examination and thereafter started his profession as Instructor at the UP College of Pharmacy. In 2013, he was appointed as the Regulatory and Quality Affairs Manager of Pharex Health Corporation. He joined Pfizer in 2017

as the Country Regulatory Affairs Lead for the innovative business unit. In 2019, he was appointed as the Head of Regulatory Affairs (Philippines) for Pfizer's biopharmaceuticals group. Paul is currently the Executive Secretary of the Philippine Pharmacists Association, Inc. (PPhA), the President of the UP Pharmacy Alumni Foundation, Inc. and the Vice President of the International Society for Pharmaceutical Engineering (ISPE)-Philippines Affiliate.

Evidence-Based Use of Nutraceuticals and other Health Products TOSHIKAZU KAMIYA, MS, PHD

Research Fellow Kyowa Hakko Bio Co. Ltd.

Dr. Toshikazu Kamiya received his B.S., M.S., and Ph.D in agricultural chemistry from the University of Tokyo. He joined Kyowa Hakko Kogyo Co., Ltd, in 1984 and began pharmaceutical research at Tokyo Research Laboratories. His research aimed at establishing unique cellular-, tissue-, or organ-culture systems that mimic body's normal or disease state to be used for screening synthetic or natural compounds beneficial for certain conditions such as alopecia.

From 1994 through 1996, Dr. Kamiya conducted research at the National Eye Institute, NIH, Bethesda MD, USA, and established a primate lens organ culture system suitable for studying mechanisms of diabetic cataract.

In 1997, his major research area extended from pharmaceutical to nutraceutical science and moved to Kyowa Hakko Tsukuba Research Laboratories. After years of systematic research, his team revealed a number of novel advantages of nutritional factors such as some specific amino acids, glutathione, or nucleic acid related compounds, in enhancing functions of muscles or brains, preventing ageing in animal models, improving skin quality, preventing skin photo-damage, preventing arthritis progression, preventing alcoholic liver damage, etc.

In addition to managing R&D, Dr. Kamiya frequently performed consumer and industry education by writing a book and review articles on amino acids, or by holding vendor sem-



inars, which contributed to consumers' correct understanding about the benefits of active dietary ingredients. Dr. Kamiya has advised finished product manufactures by providing ideas about suitable formulations for a specific concept and the target users of the finished product.

From 2010 through 2015, Dr. Kamiya was appointed President and CEO of Kyowa Hakko U.S.A., Inc. He continued to enforce scientific aspects of the key products by collaborating with universities such as Harvard, Pen State, Utah, while Dr Kamiya himself frequently appeared at industry trade shows as a speaker.

Dr Kamiya is currently a Research Fellow of Kyowa Hakko Bio. He is also Professor of the School of Integrative and Global Majors, Master's/Doctoral Program in Life Science Innovation, University of Tsukuba.

The Role of Pharmacists in Health Care Financing towards the realization of Universal Health Care

MERLA ROSE D. REYES, RPH

Chief Social Insurance Specialist Philippine Health Insurance Corporation

Abstract:

Universal Health Care (UHC) ensures that everyone has access to needed health services with sufficient quality, while ensuring that the use of these services does not lead to financial hardship. Achieving UHC requires that key agencies and stakeholders work together to achieve better health performance by all key players in the health sector.



With the enactment of the UHC Law (Republic Act No. 11223), the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation or PhilHealth becomes the major purchaser of health care services. As the national purchaser, PhilHealth will need to rationalize how it pays to providers and institute policy reforms through establishing the national costing framework and standardizing the method of collecting cost data on health services in order to become strategic in—prioritizing interventions to be funded, allocating funds properly to services that are most needed, and incentivizing health care providers to provide better quality of care.

With these, PhilHealth will need the help of competent pharmacists, among all other health workers, being the regular, if not the first, point of contact of people in the health care system, to implement the reforms on provider payment while assuring safe, effective and quality medicines are provided to the people. This would include expanding their role from compounding and dispensing to becoming a source of information on the rational and safe use of medicines including drug interactions and adverse effects both in the primary and clinical care setting, Further, the role of pharmacists in good governance is critical in improving access to affordable and quality medicines and good policy decision making thereby ensuring equity in access to medicines.

PhilHealth enjoins pharmacists to take part in making the Universal Health Care a reality for all Filipinos.

Ms. Merla Rose D. Reyes is a registered pharmacist from the University of the Philippines, and has been in government service for over 18 years holding various positions under the Philippine National Drug Policy Program (PNDPP) of the Department of Health, the Food and Drug Administration (formerly known as Bureau of Food and Drugs) and the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth), where she is currently the Head of the Product Team for Special Benefits. This team is in charge of developing benefit packages for catastrophic conditions such as cancers, open heart surgeries, kidney transplantation, and benefits for persons with disabilities, among others.

Being part of the technical team of decision makers of the health care sector, Ms. Reyes is participating in the initiatives on reforming health care financing, development and implementation of benefit packages, crafting of policies for reimbursement of medicines and other services. She was

also involved in the work on the benefit development plan which builds on the foundation of an evidence-based process for benefit package development and institutionalization of a priority-setting process in PhilHealth.

Ms. Reyes was instrumental in the conduct of health technology assessments of drugs, medical devices, diagnostics and medical and surgical procedures, among others, and in the creation of standards for accreditation of pharmacies and of other health care institutions, She also worked as a consultant of the DOH under the Philippine National Drug Policy Program handling the drug information center and has released consumer advisories on relevant issues.

The core of her present function is the conduct of policy research pertinent to benefits development and implementation, policy review, monitoring and enhancement.

CPD Area: Professional and Technical Competence

The Philosophy of Pharmaceutical Care has provided a vast opportunity for pharmacists to be involved in patient-centered care and move away from their traditional dispensing roles. The sustainability of providing these pharmaceutical services, not only requires the professional expertise of pharmacists, but also their capacity to engage in meaningful relationships with other health professionals, institutions and leaders. This plenary session highlights key initiatives that is paving the way for Filipino Pharmacists to demonstrate their positive contribution to healthcare delivery and efforts to advocate for pharmacists involvement in emerging opportunities to strengthen provision of quality pharmaceutical services in the country.

The following are the specific learning objectives for this plenary session:

- •Discuss how pharmacists provide value-added services in diabetes management

Pharmacists for Diabetes Care: An Inter-professional Education Approach PROF. CECILIA A. JIMENO, MD

Abstract:

Diabetes mellitus is a chronic non-communicable disease that requires the collaboration of physicians, nurses (diabetes nurse educators), pharmacists, dentists, exercise physiologists, podiatrists and many other health workers. This teamwork is necessary to improve compliance or adherence to both lifestyle interventions such as medical nutrition therapy and exercise, as well as of course, medications.

The primary aim of this lecture is for the attendees to demonstrate an understanding of how inter-professionalism can contribute to improving diabetes management. In many studies done internationally, persons with diabetes actually have more frequent interactions with pharmacists than their doctors. Pharmacists therefore, can play a key role in diabetes education, screening and prevention of complications, improvement of compliance and maybe even making referrals to other members of the team. This lecture will describe the collaboration that the endocrinologists and pharmacists in the Philippines have made to try to answer some of the gaps in diabetes education.

Abstract

In the Philippines, career advancement in pharmacy is usually viewed in terms of formal education and the acquisition of post-graduate degrees after completion of a baccalaureate degree. The adoption of the Philippine Qualifications Framework made it clear that in addition to formal education, the non-formal, informal education and work experience will likewise be considered in pursuing advancement along the practice track.

This development would necessitate a change of paradigm on how pharmacists see advancement in their chosen career or practice setting. While the Professional Regulation Commission Professional Regulatory Board for Pharmacy has the responsibility of setting up Specialty Boards in Pharmacy, the national professional organization could initiate the development of a framework for a setting up a credentialing system.



PPhA could establish a process wherein advancement in professional practice could be determined in terms of meeting the standards outlined in the Philippine Practice Standards for Pharmacists. In addition, the competencies would have to be defined and described by key stakeholders in the main areas of practice – community, hospital and the pharmaceutical industry. Together with a set of requirements and evaluation process comparable to other international pharmacy organizations, it is expected that Filipino pharmacists would give greater value to lifelong learning and be judicious in their choice of continuing professional education engagement, all leading to the recognition of their advanced practice.

Dr. Yolanda R. Robles obtained B.S. Pharmacy degree from the University of the Philippines and finished Masters and PhD in Pharmacy from the University of Tasmania in Australia.

She worked with the University of the Philippines for the last 29 years and at present, a Professor 8 at the College of Pharmacy. She served as the Dean of the UP College of Pharmacy (2001-2007) and was also the President of the Philippine Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (PACOP) (2004-2006) and Chair of the Commission on Higher Education Technical Committee in Pharmacy Education (2007). She was one of two lead technical experts for the TESDA Pharmacy Services National Certificate III which prepared the training regulations for pharmacy support workforce.

Currently, she is a training consultant, module developer, and facilitator for various pharmacy services in both community and hospital practice. She is the President of the Philippine Pharmacists Association (PPhA); Former President and now Honorary Advisor of the Asian Association of Schools of

Pharmacy (AASP); Former Country Chair and former President of the Asian Conference on Clinical Pharmacy (ACCP), current President-elect of the Federation of Asian Pharmaceutical Associations (FAPA) and a Council Member of the International Pharmaceutical Federation (FIP).

She served as a member of the PRC Continuing Professional Development Council for pharmacy and is a current affiliate member of the UK Royal Pharmaceutical Society. She is engaged as the Vice-Chair of the Coalition for Safe Medicines, an advocacy group supporting the FDA against Counterfeit Medicines. She had served the Philippine Department of Health as a member of the National Formulary Committee from 2006-2010 and currently, a member of the DOH Advisory Council, National Antibiotic Guidelines Committee, National AMS Steering Committee, and the National Mental Health Technical Working Group that prepared the pharmacotherapeutic guidelines and formulary formental health. As the PPhA president, she represents the organization in legislative meetings and in various partnerships meetings to move forward the mission and goals of the national professional organization.

Evolving Roles of Pharmacists in Antimicrobial Stewardship MEDIADORA S. CLAUDIO-SANIEL, MD, MBA-H

Chair, Infectious Disease Practice and Innovations Medical City

Dr M. Saniel is Professor of Medicine of the UP College of Medicine (ret. 2014) and an infectious diseases practitioner/clinician of The Medical City (TMC) where she heads the group Infectious Disease Practice and Innovations, a private partnership of adult infectious diseases specialists in the hospital.

Dr. Saniel chaired the National Technical Working Group on SARS and the National SARS Expert Group of the Department of Health (DOH) which were tasked to formulate clinical guidelines and recommend policies on SARS for health facilities in 2003. She also co-chaired the DOH Task Force on Clinical Management of Pandemic (H1N1) Influenza in 2009.



Currently, she chairs the National Antibiotic Guidelines Committee of the DOH which is involved in promoting antimicrobial stewardship as a strategic pillar in the country's plan to combat the problem of antibiotic resistance. She also heads PS-MID's Task Force on Urinary Tract Infections which collaborates with other specialty societies in formulating the national guidelines on diagnosis and management of UTI in adults. She is currently a member of the Governing Council of the Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (PCHRD).

Dr Saniel has more than 60 health-related publications, national and international. Her interests are varied infectious and tropical diseases, urinary tract infections, antimicrobial resistance, and rational antimicrobial use.

Abstract:

Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) threatens the effective prevention and treatment of an ever-increasing range of infections caused by bacteria, parasites, viruses and fungi. New resistance mechanisms are emerging and spreading globally, threatening our ability to treat common infectious diseases, resulting in prolonged illness, disability, and death. AMR is an increasingly serious threat to global public health that requires action across all government sectors and society. It is a complex problem that affects all of society and is driven by many interconnected factors. Single, isolated interventions have limited impact. Coordinated action is required to minimize the emergence and spread of antimicrobial resistance. DOH heed the call and created the Antimicrobial Stewardship (AMS) Committee which formulated the National AMS program that will consolidate all efforts and standardize the implementation of antimicrobial stewardship in the country.



The Philippine Pharmacists Association likewise responded to the urgent need and embraced Antimicrobial Stewardship as one of its priority advocacies. Through its affiliate organization – the Philippine Society of Hospital Pharmacists (PSHP), programs have been implemented to create awareness on AMR and to standardize strategies and the implementation of the antimicrobial stewardship program across all levels of health institution in the Philippines.

Pharmacists for Improved Patient Care in Government Facilities: Revitalized F1+ Botika ng Bayan

MICHAEL D. JUNSAY, RPH, CPS, MBA-H Head, Program Implementation and Monitoring Unit Pharmaceutical Division, Department of Health

Abstract:

The Department of Health (DOH) have been distributing essential medicines all over the health system nationwide though its different public health programs. The initiation of Medicines Access Programs (MAPs) have doubled number of essential medicines in government health facilities. Unfortunately, due to non-existence of healthcare professionals, some of these health facilities do not have pharmacists or assigned staff tasked to monitor these medicines.



In the past, the public health pharmacy services were concentrated only in regulatory control and administration of legislation in order to guarantee safety of the public. In the public sector, the pharmacists were only seen in government tertiary hospitals and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) since this discipline is not a priority then. It was when Pharmaceutical Division (PD) hired 219 pharmacists nationwide that are focused in monitoring the flow of these essential medicines all throughout the supply chain in public sector. Giving importance of keeping the potency of these medicines to achieve optimum patient's outcomes.

In 2016, President Rodrigo Duterte highlighted his administration's commitment to health signifying that he wants "make

sure that 'no one goes home without buying medicines" and the revival of the Botika Ng Bayan (BNB) was identified to be strategy in order to make this happen. The DOH pushed for the revival of BNB in recognition of its potential to improve access to medicines and health services which is strategically geared towards the fulfillment of the Universal Health Care (UHC).

The revitalized BNB shall be known as the FOURmula One Plus Botika ng Bayan (F1+ BNB) Program. The F1+ BNB aims to harmonize the management of medicines at the RHU level (DOH program medicines and LGU medicines) under one structure as an officially licensed pharmacy. This revived F1+BNB aims to upgrade pharmacy services at the primary care level as part of our Service Delivery Network. The goal is to achieve at least 85% coverage of our rural health units with FDA-licensed pharmacies by 2022.

The officially licensed BNB aims to provide free quality products to all Filipinos ensuring that there are no stock outs, no expired drugs and patients need for medicines are served. Also, the F1+ BNB aims to provide other pharmacy services to achieve better patients' outcomes. These include collecting patient needs data for forecasting and quantification, performing stock transfer for other RHUs in need of medicines during normal operations and emergencies and providing health promotion and educations activities such as patient counseling and pharmacovigilance.

PPhA Initiatives on Improving Patient Services in Government Facilities CRISTAN C. AGACETA, RPH

Abstract:

The Philippine Pharmacists Association Inc. advocated for the involvement of pharmacists in primary healthcare facilities through the Department of Health's (DOH) initiative on the revival of the Botika ng Bayan (BnB or 'Pharmacy of the Nation') Program. The PPhA's advocacy group engaged government leaders and policy-makers to support the inclusion of pharmacists in the primary care facilities as the main responsible healthcare professional for supply chain management and pharmacy services.

Out of pocket expenditures (00P) remain to be the major source of financing for




healthcare access in the Philippines. Only 9% of health expenditures is covered by the government/insurance and medicines continue to account for a major slice of OOP expenses. It has been reported that 75% of the health expenditures of the poor are due to medicines. While the government, through the DOH public health programs, provide free medicines, issues in supply chain integrity pose challenges in the availability, accessibility and quality of these health commodities.

The Philippine Pharmacists Association, Inc. (PPhA) took the opportunity to collaborate and support the government with the revival of the Botika ng Bayan program in 2018 to ensure that each facility will be supervised and monitored by a pharmacist who will manage the supply chain and offer pharmaceutical care to patients.
